Following the launch of our <u>new Vision for equality, diversity and inclusion (EDI) in pharmacology</u> in October 2020, we will be supporting inclusive pharmacology education as a priority for 2021. We have set up an inclusive pharmacology steering group to guide these activities, which include a review of Society curricula and making recommendations to the Education & Training Committee to improve inclusivity of pharmacology education.

Applications to join the group are now open, with details of how to join below. We hope that the group will represent all areas of pharmacology and to attract people from a wide range of backgrounds and specialist areas.

The new group will:

- 1. Contribute to the ongoing review of the <u>Society curricula</u>, with a particular focus on improving inclusivity
- 2. Recommend strategies to support inclusive pharmacology education and oversee projects agreed with the Education and Training Committee
- 3. Give advice to relevant committees and staff(e.g. to inform policy positions, meetings content and engagement opportunities).

You will hear the decision during the week beginning 3 April 2021. We are currently planning on holding the first meeting of the group during the week beginning 10 May 2021. We want to make sure everyone can participate so we will take the group's needs and access requirements into consideration when setting future meetings.

We welcome applications from people with enthusiasm for improving the inclusivity of pharmacology, and hope to receive applications from a diverse range of people.
